

2024 Spring Recycling Newsletter

It has been another successful year for the **Recycle Program** in 2023. We met and exceeded our **Recycle Goal** of 857 tons. We collected over 980 tons, great job St. Francis! That tonnage number comes from you recycling at home, in our parks and at our events.

Last year, we had 4 recycle events at our Public Works Facility. This year we are planning 5 events including the appliance and oil drop-off we had in January.

Event Dates:

April 27th, July 20th, Sept 21st, and Nov 16th

We received our waste oil bin last year so now we can take motor oil at all events. Motor oil is free but oil filters are \$.50 cents each.





Something NEW this year will be Brush Drop-off. We won't be offering curbside brush collection, instead you can drop-off your brush at Recycle Events. This is still free for residents of St. Francis. Same rules apply: no root balls, no branches larger than 4in diameter or branches longer than 8ft.

Organics Drop Off

St. Francis has a free Organics Drop-Off Program.

You can collect your food waste in the organics bucket lined with a compostable bag. When the bag is almost full, you can bring the bag to the Organics Bin in Community Park.

You can pick up an organics starter kit at public works lobby during normal working hours. Lobby hours are **6:00 am** to **4:30 pm**, Monday through Friday. The starter kit contains a kitchen bucket, a roll of compostable bags to get you started and information on organics.
