2016 Business Recycling Law

Starting January 1, 2016, businesses that have service for four cubic yards of solid waste per week are required to collect at least 3 types of recyclables. - Plastic bags & plastic wrap*
- Toys & kiddie pools
- Garden hose
- Black food trays & containers
- Containers larger than an ice cream pail/bucket
- *Plastic bags & wrap that are clean & dry are accepted at grocery/retail stores for recycling.



Household Hazardous Waste

Some household products are hazardous and should not be placed in the garbage. Take unneeded paint, cleaners, automotive fluids, fluorescent bulbs, and garden products to:

There is no charge to use the facility. The facility accepts household hazardous waste from residents of Anoka, Carver, Dakota, Hennepin, Ramsey, and Washington counties. Proof of residency required. Businesses, organizations and schools may NOT bring hazardous waste to this facility.

Anoka County Compost Sites

Anoka County has two compost sites accepting yard waste and organics (food, non-recyclable paper and certified compostable products) for composting. Sites are now open year-round weather permitting. The sites close each day at the time indicated below or sunset, if earlier.

Tree Waste, Leaves and Grass (and other soft bodied plants)

A user fee is charged for all materials dropped at the compost sites based on the materials and the size of the load. Residents are required to unload their own yard waste and take their bags and containers with them. Brush, evergreen boughs, logs and stumps are charged by the cubic yard depending on the size and amount of the material. Tree waste may be loose or bundled. Keep leaves and grass separate from tree waste as the fees are assessed separately.

Organics

Separate containers are provided at the sites for organics. Residents may drop off organics for free. For more information and to sign up for this program, go to AnokaCounty.us/recycle or by calling 763-323-5730. A free starter kit is available after you sign up for the program.
