#### Changes Coming to St. Francis!

Every year recycling changes like the seasons. St. Francis recycling is no different. We continue to look for ways to improve our program and provide more for our residents and neighbors. Remember almost 10 years ago, St. Francis held one recycle event. St. Francis has grown to 5 recycle events and provides year round drop-off opportunities for items such as holiday lights, cell phones and now organics!

In 2021, the City of St. Francis started a free Organics Drop-off Program. Organic waste, such as, food scraps, used paper towels, facial tissues and delivery pizza boxes, can be composted. Compost is very beneficial in all types of soil. That also means less material brought to landfills, which are filling up fast! When you bring your organics to the new drop-off you are preventing it from going to the landfill and you maybe able to save money on your trash bill by reducing the size of your can. Plus, the program is free! Just stop in the Public Works lobby to sign up and receive your free kit!

Something new this year is ALL St. Francis Recycling Events will be held here at St. Francis Public Works. By having all the events at Public Works, we are able to provide a central location for our residents which will make it easier for you to recycle.
